Hello everyone,

The Savior carne from another world-—-Micah 5:2 "whose going forth-—-from of old, from **eternity**.

Jesus came to this earth as a representative of eternity in which he and the Father inhabited. (Isaiah 57:15). The Savior Jesus came to this earth and tabernacled with men, we can see that spoken of by John the apostle, in John 1:14.

This was a holy divine mission. As Jesus tabernacled with his creation he represented his Father-Hebrews 1:3 " the express image (character) of God. Jesus also represented the Kingdom of God as he told the Pharisees in Luke 17:21, " the Kingdom of God is **among** you." Jesus is the **King** of that Kingdom-These are just two of the responsibilities of Jesus Christ, we need to look at Jesus through the words written about him.
